Wednesday 21st August

### 11.30am-12.30pm - TOUR: Tales from the Barracks

Join curator Lar Joye and explore the site of the Royal Barracks, now known as Collins Barracks. Starts and ends in Collins Barracks, meet in Clarke Square.

**3.00-3.45pm - TALK: 'Seán Heuston's Easter Rising on Smithfield and the South Quays'** Seán Heuston (1891-1916) was born in a Dublin tenement. He lived, worked, fought and was buried close to Collins Barracks. Find out more in an illustrated talk with John Gibney of *Historical Insights/History Ireland*. Booking required. *Venue: Lecture Theatre, Collins Barracks*.

## 11.30am-12.30pm - TOUR: Benburb Street Victuallers, Vintners, Bakers, and Army Accoutrement Makers

Join historian Siobhán Pierce for this outdoor walking tour and discover the lost history of Benburb Street. Find out how the Royal Barracks influenced the inhabitants and economics of a street. Starts and ends at Collins Barracks, meet in Clarke Square.

Cillian MacDonagh's outdoor walking tour will look at the history of the Stoneybatter area from a local perspective. *Starts and ends at Collins Barracks, meet in Clarke Square.*

#### 3.00-4.30pm - TOUR: Imperial Infrastructure: Industrial and Military Dublin
