The Socialist Labour Party was founded in November 1977 when a decision was taken at our inaugural conference in Liberty Hall Dublin to form a new political party. Its aim is to create a genuine socialist democracy in the 32 counties of Ireland.

Such a society will depend on the initiatives of many thousands of people and it will require dedication and unselfishness which we believe is readily available. We have set ourselves uncompromising standards in order to achieve our aims.

Ireland is a society that for too long has tolerated acute poverty, emigration and unemployment, with the consequent gross wastage of resources and the affronts to human dignity.

We belive that no other political party in the country will produce the necessary changes to bring about the creation of new wealth, and the redistribution of wealth and power from the rich to the working class and that, therefore we have a role in socialist education and agitation.

Through our local branches and various associated groups, Young Socialists, Womens' Rights, unemployed and trade unionists we believe in a thorough democratic involvement of our membership in decision-making and action and that this is a vital factor in the creation of a genuine socialist democracy.

(d) The outlawing of discrimination against all citizens for reasons of belief, religion, sexual preference, age or language.

## Ection 2: MEMBERSHIP

. Any person who subscribes to the Aims and Objectives of the party, accepts its constitution and is not a neriber of any other political party may be accepted as an individual member of the party.
2. A party member may also be a member of an organised political tendency within the Party, and of non-party political or quasi-political organisations. However the member shall be required to give his or her public loyalty to the Party and its Programme.
3. The National Executive of the Party shall be empowered to expel any member whose conduct is considered detrimental to the interests of the Party. Any member so expelled shall be entitled to appeal such a decision to an Appeal Board elected by Annual Conference. Both the Executive and the expelled member may further appeal the Board's ruling to Annual Conference, whose decision is final. The Appeal Board shall consist of 7 people who are not also members of the Executive.
4. Each Party member shall be required to pay a membership fee, the amount of which shall be determined by the Annual Conference. Any person who is more than 6 months in arrears in the pavment of his/her membership fee shall be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the Party.
5. The General Secretary of the Party shall maintain a register of paid-up Party members.

## Section 4: NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1. The National Executive Committee shall be elected by the Annual Conference, and shall comprise of the following membership:
(a) 6 Officers, President, Chairperson, ViceChairperson, General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary and Treasurer.
(b) 4 Ex-Officio, The Chairpersons of the Women's Committee, Young Socialists, Trade Union and Unemployed Workers Group, and Parliamentary Group.
(c) ll Ordinary nembers elected under P.R. The N.E.C. shall be empowered to co-opt 2 additional members.
2. In the interval between the National Conference the control of the organisation and the administration of Party affairs shall be carried out by the iv.E.C.
3. All members of the National Executive shall be members of the Party.
4. The National Executive shall meet at least 6 times every year.

The N.E.C. shall be entitled to appoint such committees sub-committees and officials, paid and voluntary, as may be appropriate.
6. The Party Officers shall act as a Standing Committee to undertake the routine administration of Party affairs.
7. To promote full internal debate on the farty's tactics and strategy, the N.E.C. shall circulate a monthly internal bulletin for sale to members and open to all individual contributions.
8. Because of the failure of past solutions, the working class is both divided and confused. In order to open up a debate about methods, policies and programmes the N.E.C. shall publish a monthly journal accessible to all currents of opinion in the party.

## Section 5: NATIONAL CONFERENCE

1. The ultimate control of the Party shall be exercised by the National Conference.
2. The National Conference shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided by the National Executive. It may be summoned to meet specially at any time by the decision of the National Executive. It may also be summoned to meet by petition signed by $10 \%$ of the registered paid up members.
3. Every Party member registered and paid up to the end of the previous half-year shall be entitled to attend, participate and vote at National Conference.
4. A Conference Organising Committee shall be elected by National Conference to organise all aspects of the subsequent conference. The committee shall comprise the Party Officers, and 7 Ordinary members who are not also members of the N.E.C. and who are elected by P.R.
5. Each branch of the Party shall be entitled to submit 3 resolutions for consideration by Conference. Three resolutions may also be submitted by each associated group and by the N.E.C.
6. The 7 ordinary members elected under (4) above shall constitute the Steering Committee for the subsequent Conference and shall be responsible for receiving motions for Conference and the drafting of its order paper.

## Section 6: ASSOCIATED GROUPS

1. All members of the party so eligible may belong to one or more of the following Associated Groups.
(a) Parliamentary Group
(b) Women's Committee
(c) Trade Union and Unemployed Workers Group
(d) Young Socialists.
2. Only members of the Party shall be entitled to be members of the Associated Groups.
3. Each group shall be entitled to draw up its own constitution, rules and standing orders, and to conduct its own affairs, but shall be subject in every respect to the over-riding authority of the N.E.C.
4. The National Women's Committee of the Party shall be an elected body of the women members of the Party recallable by a simple majority at any national women's meeting.

## Section 7: ELECTIONS

1. The Naticnal Executive shall decide what elections are to be contested by the party subject to any decisions of the National Conference.
2. The National Executive shall convene a Selection Conference for the purpose of choosing Party candidates and.shall draw up appropriate standing orders
